- · Go to southhamptonpubliclibrary.follettdestiny.com
- Click on South Hampton Public Library
- · Then in the upper right-hand corner, select Create Account
- You will be prompted to enter your last name and your library card number (barcode)
- · Select a User Name, Password, Confirm Password, (Email is optional), and "Save"
- Use the "My Info" tab to view your Items Out, Fines, Holds, and Recommended Titles,
- · as well as your checkout history.
- · When you're done, log out at the top right corner!

Barnard School students have returned to school following their holiday break with a continued focus on kindness. As part of our school's SEL initiative, students have been working on behavioral strategies that promote kindness, positivity and inclusivity. Last month's theme was Listening Matters. Students learned about the importance of listening without judgment, criticism or interruption, while being aware of their internal thoughts and reactions. This month, students will focus on Actions Matter. Students will be asked to be cognizant of their actions and to express kindness not only in words but in their actions. They will learn that words are meaningless without the follow-through with their actions.

SAU 21 Superintendent, Meredith Nadeau, has started a Superintendent Student Leadership Team to involve students in the decision making process at the SAU. Team members are able to provide input on goals and strategies for implementing the Portrait of a Learner later in the year and they will weigh in on a variety of topics such as school safety, school community, curriculum, and opportunities for students. All 7th and 8th grade students were encouraged to apply for the position. Barnard School is proud of Violet Davis (gr. 7) and Isabel Vaillencourt (gr.8) for being chosen for this leadership team.

The Student Council will be holding their Winter Wonderland Dance on January 20th. Students in grades 5-8 are invited to attend. The dance will take place from 6:30-8:30 in the school gymnasium. Students are looking forward to this event!
