Meet new people who now live in South Hampton. Welcome them to town.


There is one catch. You must be 65 years old or more in 2023.

# **Barnard School News**

Barnard School will be busy celebrating Read Across America month this March! They have several activities planned for their celebration. Staff and students will kick off the month with an all school "read-in" in the gym on March 3. Students will gather in the gym and read together for a half hour under a starry sky to celebrate literacy. Students in grades K-3 will participate in Barnard School's annual March Book Madness Challenge where all students will read sixteen (16) high-interest picture books that promote diversity, equity, inclusion and contain SEL themes. Each week, students will vote on their favorite book, and eventually, they will vote for the winner of the challenge. Additionally, Barnard students will be treated to guest readers from the community who will visit classrooms to read aloud to elementary students. Students in grades 4-8 will participate in a One Book One School Project. Every student in grades 4-8 will be issued the book Staffish by Lisa Pipps. Students will be reading and discussing the book in their classes, with one another and with family members. The goal is to promote reading and discussing the important themes the book has to offer.

Earlier this year, students with parent/guardian permission completed the PEAR (Partnerships in Education and Resilience) Holistic Student Assessment. The school had a very strong response from families, with 92% participation in grades 3-8. This assessment supported the school's efforts to promote the positive social-emotional development of the school community and students. Research shows that helping students feel good about themselves, their school, and their relationships improves learning.

The data collected helps Barnard to better understand their students as individuals and their student body as a whole. Barnard staff were pleased with the results of the assessment which indicate that, overall, the student body is within healthy benchmarks in all four core developmental areas. In particular, the assessment identified the school's top three strengths in the areas of Relationships with Peers (37%), Empathy (31.48%) and Perseverance (29.63%). Administration attributes this to the work the school counselor and staff have done over the past three years in their SEL programs that emphasize relationship building and growth mindset.

The assessment also identified three top areas of challenges for the collective student group in the areas of Optimism (24%), Reflection (18.5%) and Academic Motivation (16.6%). The staff is addressing these challenges through their work with competency-based education and the continuation of their strong SEL program. They are optimistic that their adoption of Habits of Learning/CARES, and students' weekly goal setting and reflection processes will aid in these improvements.
